Daniel Weaver: do you still classify as mild, moderate, severe for Gambling?

Adam Lake: I have seen multiple endurance athletes fall into SUDs when they develop injuries and can't exercise enough - is this something in the literature or just a quirk of my experience

- Leslie Hayes: I've definitely seen the other direction a lot as well, where people overcome SUD's by starting endurance sports.
